1. We display our transformed life by staying on good terms with each other. (13:1)

2. We display our transformed life by showing hospitality to strangers. (13:2)

13:2 “Do not neglect [or “forget” **(NLT)**] to show hospitality to strangers.” **(ESV)** “Be ready with a meal or a bed when it’s needed,” **(MSG)** “for by this some have entertained angels without knowing it.” **(NASB)**

HEBREWS 13:2

“For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me... I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of Mine, you did for Me.”

3. We display our transformed life by empathizing with those who suffer as if their suffering happened to us. (13:3)
